Barbara Baroff Kavanagh



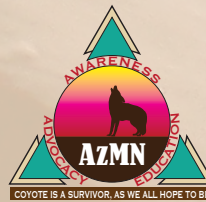

AzMN, a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization, started in 2004 as a grassroots cancer advocacy and community education organization to support cancer patients like Barbara's husband, so they do not have to fight this disease alone.

In 2007, Barbara co-founded the Tissue Donor Awareness Program, TDAP™, which she has presented throughout Arizona. She was honored by the Governor for her work on behalf of myeloma patients and the TDAP™ program. In August 2008, Barbara received the prestigious Phoenix Business Journal's Health Care Heroes Award in the Education category. She also was honored by the Arizona Rural Health Care Association as Volunteer of the Year.

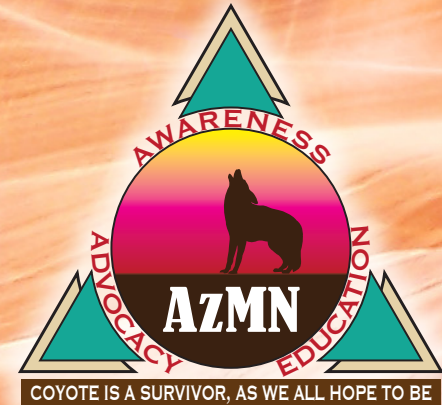
Barbara has conducted successful volunteer management, team building and stress management programs throughout the U.S. and Europe, including Holland, Germany, Turkey, England and Ireland. She has been on the faculties of several universities including, Boston University and Arizona State University. Barbara has a Master's Degree in Social Work from Boston University and a BA from Duke University. She has published numerous professional articles and is the author of "Training Volunteers for the New Millennium: An International Connection", and co-author of "The New Volunteerism: A Community Connection", and "The New Partnership: Human Services Business and Industry."

WHAT IS MYELOMA?

Multiple myeloma is a complex and often misdiagnosed cancer of the bone marrow that affects plasma cells, which comprise the immune system and bone. The cause is unknown and there are over 1,600 new cases of myeloma diagnosed each month in the USA.

There is no cure, but myeloma is treatable. With the new research we are supporting, better treatment and new medications are saving lives, and hopefully will lead to a cure.

AzMN was founded in June 2004 by Barbara B. Kavanagh. Our mission is to promote awareness, education and advocacy for improved treatment and quality of life, for multiple myeloma patients, their families and caregivers.

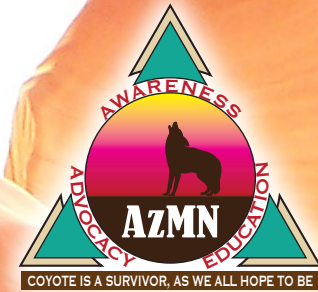
OUR VISION
